Monster Mambo

Composer Lauren Bernofsky has written over a hundred works, including solo, chamber, and choral music, as well as larger-scale works for orchestra, film, musical, opera, and ballet. Her music has been described as a fantastic balance between the emotional and intellectual: technical and lyrical side of 21st Century composition.

A mambo is a lively dance and music genre that originated in Cuba in the 1930s. Its roots can be traced back to earlier Cuban musical styles, particularly son and danzón, as well as the influence of early jazz and Afro-Cuban rhythms.

Inspired by the traditional Mambo dance, **Monster Mambo**, written in the key of D minor, features a catchy bass line, a syncopated melody, and eerie harmonies, that all combine to evoke a variety of Monsters dancing under a full moon.

Jump in the Line

Jump in the Line (Shake, Senora) is a calypso song composed by Lord Kitchener and best known from a version recorded by vocalist Harry Belafonte in 1961. Perhaps its most memorable appearance is at the end of the the 1988 Tim Burton comedy horror film *Beetlejuice*. The song also appeared in the 2019 Broadway musical stage adaptation of *Beetlejuice*, as the finale.

The story of the movie *Beetlejuice* revolves around a recently deceased couple, who, as ghosts, are not allowed to leave their house. They contact Betelgeuse, a sleazy "bio-exorcist," to try to scare the house's new inhabitants away.

The film's success spawned an animated television series, video games, a stage musical, and a recently-released sequel, Beetlejuice Beetlejuice.

Dia De Los Muertos

Dia de los Muertos is a festive piece depicting the Day of the Dead celebration that is observed in Mexico and other Latin American countries each year at the beginning of November. According to popular belief, on the Day of the Dead, the spirits of the dead return to commune with the living, and this celebration commemorates the deceased so they might rest in peace.

The low strings quote the "Dies Irae" ("Day of the Wrath") from the Requiem Mass. This melody is soon transformed into the main theme of the piece. This infectious tune is presented in rondo form, and is meant to depict the energetic celebrations that take place in the streets as part of the holiday. Cellos and basses strum their instruments, imitating Spanish guitars as the upper strings play *col legno*, depicting the procession and arrival of the *angelitos* (little angels), the spirits of deceased children. A tender and simple melody is introduced by the first violins, and then shared by the entire orchestra. The "Dance of the Little Old Men" follows. In some places, boys perform this dance, hobbling around with canes, holding their backs in pain and wearing masks that look like funny old men. As the dance continues, the dancers become younger, stomping merrily about.

Music from "Coco"

The 2017 Disney/Pixar movie tells the story of Miguel, a young boy who dreams of becoming an accomplished musician like his idol, Ernesto de la Cruz, in spite of his family's baffling ban on music. Desperate to prove his talent, Miguel finds himself in the stunning and colorful Land of the Dead following a mysterious chain of events. Along the way, he meets charming trickster Héctor, and together they set off on an extraordinary journey to unlock the real story behind Miguel's family history.

This arrangement of **Music from "Coco"** features three hit songs from the movie: *Remember Me, Un Poco Loco*, and *Proud Corazon*.

Transylvanian Tango

While the origins of the vampire legend are murky, our contemporary knowledge of vampires comes from Eastern Europe, where the mythology was concentrated. During the 17th and 18th centuries, mass hysteria over the undead periodically swept the region, spilling over occasionally into Western Europe.

The modern concept of the suave, gentleman vampire was created by John Polidori in his 1819 novel "The Vampyre: A Tale," which launched a literary movement of vampire books. The greatest and most influential vampire story, however, came much later with Bram Stoker's "Dracula" (1897).

Today, vampires continue to capture our imagination. The 21st century vampire is a complex character, devilish yet also sympathetic.

Composer Zach Wallmark's composition **Transylvanian Tango** represents the dark, mysterious, and romantic element of popular vampire mythology, depicting the graceful motions of skilled tango dancers. Each voice that enters is a new character in the ever-evolving dance. The tone changes as cellos and violas take the melody and violins supply the jazz-influenced harmonies, while the basses are the pumping heart that spreads life through the body of the ensemble. To represent the vampires' extreme old age and genteel sophistication, the middle section catapults us back to the Baroque era with a brief section of counterpoint, with the tango feel returning for the ending.

Darkened Shadows

Composer Joshua Reznicow has had works commissioned and performed throughout the United States, Canada, and Europe with works for professional and young groups alike, including string orchestra, full orchestra, concert bands, film, and chamber ensembles.

His 2015 work **Darkened Shadows** features a melodic theme that utilizes many 16th note double-stops (playing two notes at once). This work also features ample melodic material for the lower strings, along with a haunting middle section that seizes the imagination. Reznicow uses shimmering harmonies to complement the eerie melody to give a ghastly thrill. Unlike most works, this piece doesn't have a very clear ending- the ensemble unites under a quick tempo to create a strong wall of sound, but soon after, the sound rapidly trickles away, ending mysteriously, leaving the audience wondering if it's truly the end...

The Mysterious House

Imagine this: a dark, spooky night with the wind howling. There is an old mysterious house - it has damaged windows, a collapsed chimney and the facade is dilapidated. Long abandoned, locals believe that no one lives there anymore. But is that true?

What might be hidden in this mysterious house? The moment we enter, the floor and the doors start to creak, curtains move and - the long forgotten ghosts return and dance through the crumbling walls. The house comes to life!

Instead of running out immediately we take courage and go on exploring. We find some eerie corners and drafty rooms in the house: the dusty library, the spooky bedroom, the gloomy attic... Caution is required there!

Suddenly we hear strange noises. What can that be? The creaking doors? The howling wind? No, these are the sounds of the dancing ghosts! The mysterious house is still lively. But maybe it's better to find your way out...

Heart Wounds

"Heart Wounds," first published in 1881, is the first movement from Norwegian composer Edvard Grieg's "Two Elegiac Melodies." The two movements are Grieg's instrumental arrangements of songs he originally wrote for voice and piano. Poetry by fellow Norwegian Aasmund Olavsson Vinje provided the original text.

Vinje's words in this movement relate that wounds have been suffered by the heart in the struggles of life, but it has survived, with faith intact.

Heart Wounds is in the key of C minor. There are three verses: in verse 1 the melody is played by the first violins; in verse 2 by the cellos, with an insistent eighth-note accompaniment from all other parts, contrasting with the other verses; and in verse 3 by the first violins, the orchestration being similar to the first verse, but heavier and more urgent.

Prelude from "Psycho"

The movie Psycho was the sixth collaboration between film director Alfred Hitchcock and composer Bernard Herrmann, and is one of the most iconic horror/thriller movies, perhaps establishing the genre.

Hitchcock always acknowledged the importance of Herrmann's music to the success of the film, saying that "33% of the effect of Psycho is due to the music." Herrmann, for his part, commented that 'Hitchcock only finishes a picture 60%: I have to finish it for him.' Herrmann's response to Hitchcock's disturbing, violent masterpiece was to match the stark, cold, black and white images of the film with music 'in black and white', as he put it, by using only the string section of the orchestra in his score. Herrmann created tense, cold, ruthless music, evoking madness at times, but also with occasional moments of tenderness.

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
